
In the temple cemetery is the grave of Gonnojo Yoshida, the founder of Angyo Gardens.

Mitsuzouin (Minor Temple)

Located on Angyo Hill, the road leading up to the temple has a tunnel of cherry blossoms called Angyozakura. This outstanding cherry blossom spot has been covered many times by media outlets.

Wild anemone flowers



The anemone nikoensis, which puts forth lovely white flowers in spring, is designated as a natural treasure of Kawasaki City. This forest was once full of illegally dumped litter, but volunteers discovered anemone flowers growing wild and cleaned up the area so that they could spread. The anemone is an important plant and a near-endangered species on Saitama Prefecture's Red List.


Kouzenin (Minor Temple)

Manyo Gardens / Furusato no Mori Forest




Manyo Gardens See many of the plants immortalized in the poems of the Manyoshu. Enjoy Japanese poetry as you observe on the
